The new club website is now up and running. We have new forum, calendar and will have a better member's only area. If you are a paid up 2004 member you will get access to the website. Here are the steps to get activated on the new member's only website.

- 1. Pay your 2004 membership, you can join at http://www.millenniumdiggers.com/join.shtml.
- 2. Go to http://www.millenniumdiggers.com/members.shtml and click on "REQUEST ACCESS"!
- 3. Put a check in the box next to "I agree to the above terms and conditions".
- 4. Please enter your desired account username in the box (example: DIG4AU, wyodredger, TomOR).
- 5. Enter your email address in the next two boxes. This is very important you enter a valid email address. The system will then send email to the webmaster.
- 6. Webmaster will approve your account if the treasurer acknowledges you have paid for your 2004 membership.
- 7. After you receive an email from the webmaster you will have to reply to the

- email to validate your account. Instructions on how to do this will be in the email.
- 8. This system works, if it is does not work for you; it is because you don't have your browser configured properly. It is suggested that you use Internet Explorer to view the pages on this site.

After you have gotten register on the Members Only area, you will want to get access to the **Members Only Forum**. Here are the steps to get activated.

- 1. Go to
- 2. http://www.millenniumdiggers.com/cgibin/dcforum/dcboard.cgi?az=user_register
- 3. Accept the "Forum Acceptable Use Policy" by clicking the: "Accept" button.
- 4. You will now be registered on the main forum, but you will not have access to member's forum yet.
- 5. You need to email tom@tomashworth.com and request access to members only area. Include your name, username and password in the email.
- 6. Tom will approve your access and email you back when you have access (Tom is gone most of the summer, so in the summer this may take some time).
- 7. You will have to logout of the forum.
- 8. If you are using Internet Explorer (I don't know how to do it in other browsers), go to **TOOLS** -> **INTERNET OPTIONS** -> **GENERAL** tab. Next under "Temporary Internet Settings" click **DELETE COOKIES.** Next, click on **SETTINGS** and make sure the "every visit to the web page" is checked.
- 9. Now log back into the forum and you should have access.

If you are still having problems email tom@tomashworth.com and try and resolve it with him via email or you can talk to him at meeting and maybe he can help.
