Rocks Shared Beginning With the Letter "R": Marlea brought a "red" petrified rock. Delmon had his "found" rocks cut and shared the geode inside. -Penny brought a piece of "Rutilated quartz" (quartz containing needles of the mineral rutile), sometimes called "Venus Hairstone", its chemical composition is titanium dioxide. -Also, 2 natural Ruby crystals, and several tiny synthetic ruby crystals used in electronics. The chem. comp. is aluminum oxide (corundum/hardness #9), -a pink stone called Rodochrosite, its chem. comp. is magnesium carbonate, -and a Rhodolite garnet (a pink variety of pyrope garnet) its chem. comp. is magnesium aluminum silicon oxide.

<u>In Sept, Rocks Beginning With the Letter "S"</u>......Bring in your Sunstones? Silver? Sapphires? Synthetic Silicon (remember Siltec)? Serpentine, soapstone?
